Unity of Knowledge: Possible is it desirable? Two rival visions clash: one seeks a single way of explaining everything known and knowable about ourselves and the universe; the other champions diverse modes of understanding served by disparate kinds of evidence. Contrary views pit science against the arts and humanities. Scientists generally laud and seek convergence; artists and humanists deplore amalgamation as a threat to humane values. These opposing perspectives flamed into hostility in the 1950s. Two cultures clash. They culminate today in new efforts to conjoin insights into physical nature and human culture and new fears lest such syntheses submerge what the arts and humanities most value.

This book stemming from David Lowenthal's inaugural Stockholm Archipelago Lectures explores the two cultures' quarrel's underlying ideologies. Lowenthal shows how ingrained bias toward unity or diversity shapes major issues in education, religion, genetics, race relations, heritage, governance and environmental policy aimed at a general academic audience. Quest for the Unity of Knowledge especially targets those in conservation, ecology, history of ideas, museology and heritage studies. What kinds of knowledge do international relations theories seek? How do they search for it and claim to have found it? Lebow uses his answers to these questions to say something important about the theory project in IR and in the social sciences more generally. Science and the Quest for Reality is an interdisciplinary anthology that situates contemporary science within its complex philosophical, historical and sociological contexts. The anthology is divided between firstly characterizing science as an intellectual activity and secondly defining its social role. The philosophical and historical vicissitudes of science's truth claims has raised profound questions concerning the role of science in society beyond its technological innovations. The deeper philosophical issues thus complement the critical inquiry concerning the broader social and ethical influence of contemporary science in the tradition of the main trends of the modern world series. This volume includes both classical and contemporary works on the subject.

This book deals with the quest for a divided welfare state in Sweden. The prime example is the rapid rise of private health insurance which now constitutes a parallel system characterized by state subsidies for some and not for others. This functions as a kind of reverse means testing whereby primarily the upper classes get state support for new types of welfare consumption. Innovatively Lapidus explains how such a parallel system requires not only direct and statutory state support but also indirect support for example from infrastructure built for the public health system. He goes on to examine how semi-private welfare funding is dependent on private provision and how the so-called hidden welfare state gradually erodes the visible and former universal welfare state model. In direct contrast to its own stated goals who benefits from privatized welfare? How are the privatization of delivery and the privatization of funding linked? How does this impact public willingness to pay tax? All of these questions and more are discussed in this accessible volume.
